Rushmoor Neighbourhood Watch Association (RNWA) - AGM 2019

This has been an exciting and very hectic year for the reorganised RNWA structure. RNWA Members/Coordinators had an EGM in Jan 2018 and decided to change the structure and way we operate Neighbourhood Watch (NW) in Rushmoor. This has taken a lot of effort from the newly formed RNWA Steering Committee who have been mandated at the EGM to reorganise and restructure NW in Rushmoor.

The focus of our first year has been to review and improve our systems, processes, literature and build solid working relationships with civic agencies and other associations. We have helped start-up some new Community Forums and rebuild existing groups. We have a very good relationship with other NW groups in Hampshire via the County NW Association. We have built on our relationship with Rushmoor Borough Council and are now integrating with the Safer North Hants operation and working closely with its team. The Police have opened-up communications with RNWA and we now have regular meetings with the Senior Police Officers in Rushmoor.

We have been working hard to raise awareness and engagement of Rushmoor residents with Neighbourhood Watch. To support this, our Publicity Officer (Yvonne) has had 40,000 trifold "Join Us" leaflets printed which are being distributed to all households in Rushmoor. Meanwhile, our Membership Secretary (Ian) has been working hard to support new enquiries for joining or setting up a Neighbourhood Watch. As a user of Hampshire Alert, you already know the facility is our lifeline to you, so please continue to encourage your family and friends, neighbours and colleagues to register on Hampshire Alert. Ian has some step-by-step guides to help them register, just email membership@RNWA.org.uk

Work with the RNWA website is progressing with the help of our NW friends in Hampshire and we are at the point of going live, having our own RNWA page hosted on the NW County website.

Finally, we still need volunteers on the Steering Committee. It is only an hour or so of work, once a month. It's great fun! You get to know new people and contacts in Rushmoor, you will pick-up new skills and you will get that nice feeling that you are putting something back into the community...which is what Neighbourhood Watch is all about.

Summary

Again, this month, Farnborough Central has had no dwelling burglaries. Other areas of Farnborough have seen an increase however, so residents are urged to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity in their neighbourhood.

The Farnborough Central team have been out in the community at planned events in Sainsbury's and Barclays Bank this month. Both events received very positive feedback from the public and we will look to schedule some more in the future. Let us know if you have any preferred locations for the local team to visit.

Anti-social vehicles have been an ongoing theme throughout February, with large car meets on consecutive days in Farnborough Gate Retail Park. Police have been working closely with site management to organise a long-term solution. Discussions are ongoing with other private land owners of popular destinations for these meets and the local Council, to ensure any plan put in place doesn't just move the problem 'down the road' and offers better protection for the whole of Farnborough.

Community Priority Updates

1- Theft of pedal cycles

This month there have been 3 thefts of pedal cycle reported. This is still low level, but Police have noted a slight increase from last month and are monitoring the issue. 2. Theft from motor vehicles

This priority has remained very low level as with the last two months with just two reports. Police will continue to monitor this but may look to change the priority during March, when the community panel meet to discuss the priorities.

Summary

This month we have received two reports of burglary. Entry was gained on both occasions by force via the kitchen. The locations of these burglaries were Lye Copse Avenue and Meadow Road. Gold jewellery was taken from the Meadow Road property. No items believed to have been taken from the Lye Copse property. The victim awoke to find a male figure at his bedroom door wearing a balaclava. The victim shouted and the male fled the property.

Please ensure that you are being vigilant around security by considering measures such as CCTV, security lights, window alarms, timer switches etc. Please contact police if you see any suspicious activity near to properties.

There has been one incident of theft of tools from a van in Totland Close and also two incidents of number plate thefts in Chapel Lane and Hawley Lane.

We are still waiting for the Council to install a barrier at Farnborough Town Football Club. We are told that there has been a delay due to installation difficulties but it should be installed very soon.

Summary

The main issue for the last month has been a group of approximately ten youths who have been causing criminal damage to cars, windows and fences in the North Camp area. The majority of incidents have been during the school half term and late at night, although there have been other incidents sporadically for the last couple of months.

Identifying the culprits has not been an easy task due to the miscreants managing to avoid the majority of CCTV in the area. The Neighbourhoods Team have made several enquiries with local businesses in order to get shots of them in the area around the appropriate times. We have met with the local school and identified the majority of the group, so we can now start making contact with the parents. This will be done once any criminal investigation has been completed. If there are any parents in the area who allow their children out after dark it is important that you know where your children are and what they get up to.

The Operation Rafter series of burglaries have reduced in number but there have been a further two this month. Properties in Osborne Road and Blaise Close had forced entry to the rear of the buildings. Reassurance has been provided to the victims by local PCSOs and witness appeal letters have gone out to the nearby neighbours.

One theft of tools from a works van this month and one report of car number plates being stolen

2. Anti-Social behaviour (ASB)

The majority of ASB has been attributed to the group of youths mentioned in the summary above. There was a report of a scooter set on fire in the Queens Road Recreation Ground but no suspects were identified. Youths in the area were spoken to and their details were taken.

Summary

Burglaries: Unfortunately there have been nine burglaries in Farnborough West during the month of February. Most of the properties were entered by either forcing the front door or by forcing a window at the rear of the address. At present no one has been arrested, however, we are still currently investigating these.

Please can we remind all residents to take preventative measures to reduce the chances of you becoming a victim of this crime. We would advise all residents to purchase window alarms as a cheap preventative measure. We also strongly advise the option of CCTV/Burglar alarms to further protect your properties.

Community Priority Updates:

1. Target and reduce drug related offences, including drug supply and drug related violence across the Farnborough West Neighbourhood.

One address that was currently an Operation Fortress address is no longer of interest to the Police. This is due to the regular checks to disrupt and tackle the ongoing issue. It so also due to the partnership working of Police, Housing and Adult Services which enabled the correct support to be put in place which resolved the issue.

We are continuing our work around this priority and if you have information about drug-related crime where you live, contact:

2. To reduce criminal damage and in particular graffiti within the Ward. To prevent, investigate and prosecute those responsible where sufficient evidence is present. To also ensure cleaning of graffiti within the wards.

This is a new priority and officers will be forming a proactive plan to target this issue. This will include working with relevant partner agencies to investigate and improve the area. This work will be ongoing and specific actions taken will be updated within the next newsletter, however, Police patrols will be completed and the local team are already making enquiries to identify those responsible.

Summary

We continue to carry out plain clothes operations within the town centre on targeting purse thieves and shoplifters.

The Public Space Protection Order within the town centre has been used on several occasions this month by officers to assist in preventing anti-social behaviour (ASB) and move on people who continue to cause a nuisance.

Aldershot NPT officers carried out a drugs warrant in the area leading to the arrest of three males. A quantity of drugs was seized and a possible taser used.

PCSO Godbold has assessed Cranmore Lane and is pushing forward implementing a speed watch in the area.

The area continues to be targeted for burglary and theft from vehicles. We encourage residents to ensure that both property and vehicles are left secure.

Our Community priorities remain the same.

Our dwelling burglary rate has remained relatively stable with four reports during the last month. Neighbouring areas have seen a recent increase in burglaries so the advice remains that we should remain vigilant, report suspicious behaviour and follow crime prevention advice that can be found on www.hampshire.police.uk

With the recent uncharacteristic warm weather, please remember to consider the security of your home and be aware that opportunistic thieves will take advantage of open doors and windows. We know this is frustrating as we all like to let the fresh air into our homes, but with a little extra thought and care we can still enjoy the fresh air without jeopardising our security.

Reports of thefts from motor vehicles have decreased slightly this month. We are aware that these offences are not always reported if there is no damage and low value items are stolen. Please do report all incidents so that we can build an accurate picture of where and when crimes are occurring. Hopefully a recent custodial sentence for a repeat offender will help keep the commission rate for this crime type low.

Please DO NOT make it easy for criminals. Do not leave valuables inside the vehicle and double check that you have locked it before leaving. Do not rely on familiar sounds of locking.
